



Why eradicate Parkinsonia

- Parkinsonia is one of Australia's most invasive and destructive weeds.
- Under the Commonwealth Government it has been declared a "weed of national significance", meaning landowners have a legal responsibility to control its spread.
- Parkinsonia has the potential to invade up to 70% of Australia's mainland and is one of the worst weed threats to Australia's rangelands.
- The dense impenetrable thickets have significant impacts on productivity and land values.
- Eradicating Parkinsonia means increased carrying capacity through improved pasture utilisation and access to waterways.
- Eradicating Parkinsonia means improved property management including erosion control, fire management, vermin management and easier mustering.
- Eradicating Parkinsonia increases land value and land use!
